Dear Parent or Guardian,

This spring the Vermont Department of Education identified Mt. Anthony Union High School as a school that did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in reading and math based on the New England Common Assessment (NECAP) taken in October 2009. As a result, parents of eligible students may request free tutoring services. Eligible students are those who qualify for the federal free and reduced lunch program regardless of whether or not they are meeting school academic expectations. Tutoring services are available from approved providers; the list of providers is enclosed.

If you would like to use one of the attached providers for tutoring, we will meet with you to develop a contract with the provider; the school will then pay the provider directly. There is a cap on the amount of money per student that the school can spend on services for any child each year. Schools are not required to pay transportation for students to any provider.

There is no cost for these services to eligible students. You may contact the school office for an application for the free and reduced lunch program if you have not already completed one this year or if your status has changed. If you do not wish to access free or reduced lunch, you may provide evidence to prove eligibility.
